#### THE FALL OF MAN

When Adam and Eve disobeyed God's direct command, sin entered the human race and corrupted creation. God's judgment on sin is death. Genesis 3.

#### **NOAH'S FLOOD**

This was a worldwide flood and our world today carries much evidence for it. God intervened because of the great wickedness of the people. Genesis 6.





This event explains how the thousands of different human languages came about. It also explains the migration of humans to all the four corners of the earth. Genesis 11.



This was accompanied by great miracles of God including the parting of the Red Sea. This miracle preceded the forming of the people of Israel, as God's chosen people to reveal Him to the rest of the world. Exodus 12-15.





#### THE BIRTH OF JESUS CHRIST

God came to earth and into human history as a baby, born of the virgin Mary. Christ was born to die for the sins of the whole world. Matthew 1; Luke 2.

### THE RESURRECTION OF JESUS CHRIST

Jesus died and 3 days after, He bodily rose from the dead, never to die again. Matthew 28; Mark 16; Luke 24; John 20-21. The birth of Christ, the death of Christ and the Resurrection of Christ reverse the effect of the 1st event.



#### THE RETURN OF JESUS CHRIST

Jesus returns as King and Judge of the world. God has given us the signs that will precede such a time. This event brings history to a close. Matthew 24-25.

### THE GOSPEL'S POINT OF VIEW

#### **CHRISTMAS - WHEN GOD ENTERED OUR WORLD**

## Christ was born into a world much like ours today.

Jesus entered a troubled world, laced with evil and violence.

The birth of Jesus took place in the time of a chronic dictator. Herod the Great was the Roman king of Judea. He was famed for his colossal building projects, the most famous being the expansion of the 2nd Temple in Jerusalem.

He was known as Herod the Great, yet his epithet of "the Great" is widely disputed—he was "a madman who murdered his own family and a great many rabbis."

#### The Massacre of the Innocents

Matthew 2:16-18

Herod ordered the execution of all young male children, 2 years and under, in the vicinity of Bethlehem, so as to avoid the loss of his throne to a newborn King of the Jews whose birth had been announced to him by the Magi.

### The Flight to Egypt

Matthew 2: 13-15

Having been warned of Herod's plan to kill baby boys, Jesus' parents had to flee to Egypt with Jesus and they stayed there for quite some time until the death of Herod.

Jesus and his parents were displaced people, living as refugees in Egypt.

At Christmas, Jesus Christ came into our world. Your world and my world, today, can be transformed by His presence.


## In heaven, the parallel is seen in the picture of the woman and the dragon.
