




Boasting in the Lord our God

Our text in a nutshell...

- Paul wants to tell the Corinthian church that reliance on human wisdom alone is insufficient and incapable of bringing about salvation.
- He wants to move them to rely instead on God



Boasting in the Lord?

“This word (translated ‘boast’) presents considerable difficulty for translation. It can mean “to take pride in” or “to glory in,” hence “boast.” But at times, especially here, it comes very close to the concept of “trust,” that is, “to put one’s full confidence in.”
